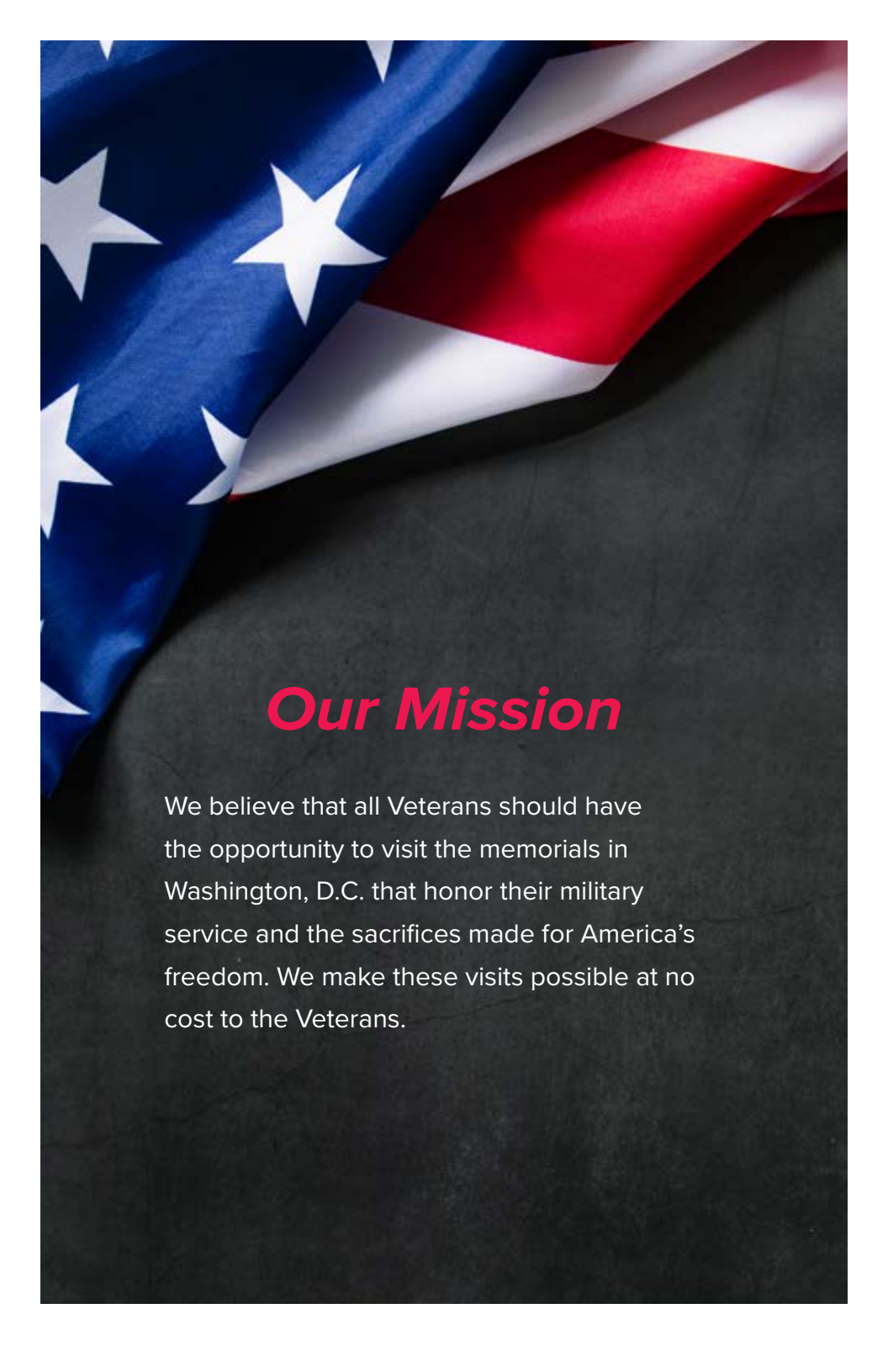

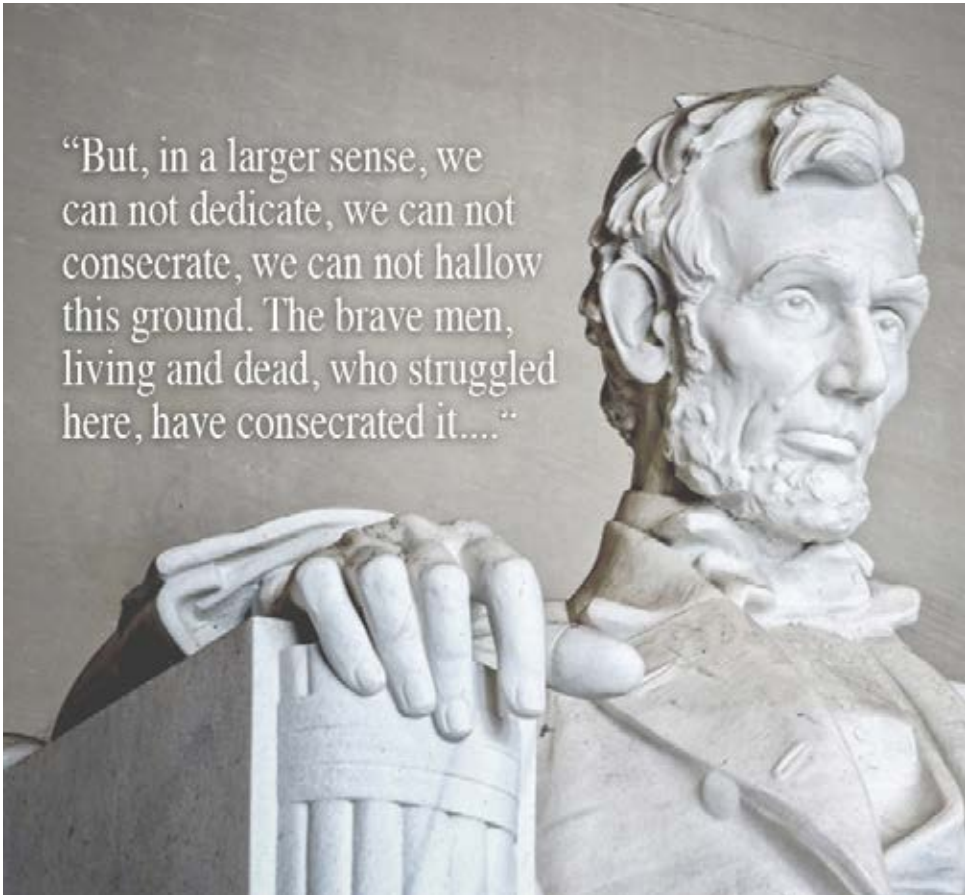

There are less than 66,000 Americans alive today who served in World War II, and that number is dwindling fast. For this reason, Honor Flight prioritizes flying our WWII Veterans first to see the monument dedicated to their service in our next flights. Our efforts then focus on Korean War and Vietnam War Era Veterans.

Flag City Honor Flight Funding

Flag City Honor Flight is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization, fully staffed by unpaid volunteers, and totally funded by donations. Our status as a non-profit organization means all donated funds raised are regulated and placed into a general fund for Flag City Honor Flight trips. No state or local funds are received.

Flag City Honor Flight History

Flag City Honor Flight officially joined the Honor Flight Network[®] in 2010. The cost of each flight is approximately \$100,000. This includes the expenses of a chartered flight, buses, food, t-shirts, memorabilia for the Veterans, insurance, training, and other costs.

The Flag City Honor Flight chapter formed to handle overflow from Toledo's chapter, NWO Honor Flight, which stopped flying in 2014. Our chapter is now the only one in our area and serves Veterans around Northwest Ohio, Southeastern Michigan and beyond.

Over 2,000 Veterans have been taken to Washington DC to see their memorials from 2010-2024!
